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Inspirational Learning Environment

- The success of both Crosshill and BCHS has seen student numbers rise year on year and in both schools these have increased in excess of 50% since 2013.
- To accommodate this growth we have been seeking a new premises for some time.
- Delighted to work in partnership with BwD to refurbish and bring life back into the Sunnyhurst site
- Project is planned in two phases. Phase one will be the restoration of the beautiful house and grounds, phase two will be the refurbishment and remodelling of the separate buildings to create bespoke learning spaces for the young people in our community.



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All about Crosshill School

Crosshill School is part of Champion Education Trust and is an academy day special school for children between the ages 11-18 who mostly experience Moderate Learning Difficulties.

The school also caters for students who have Autistic Spectrum Disorder which is significantly impacting upon their ability to access the curriculum, along with students who have physical, visual and hearing difficulties.


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Allocated site for the relocation of Crosshill School

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Phase 1 aiming to be completed by September 2021

- 7 classrooms
- Dining Hall
- Conference room
- Playground facilities and forest school set up
- Catering facilities
- Reception/welcome area for visitors
- Therapy provision
- Wide variety of office and admin spaces
- Wide variety of storage facilities
- Staff facilities including kitchenette

Phase 2 aiming to be completed by September 2022

- Extra classrooms
- Allowing space to create a separate sixth form centre to allow for further preparing into the adulthood resources
- Multi- purpose room for sports, dining and assemblies

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• Further therapy provision spaces

Benefits of relocation

- Providing us with opportunity to expand and meet local authority need
- Bringing our secondary and post 16 together onto one site
- Providing a more specialist environment for our students and their families, assisting us to fully embed our curriculum model (academic, wellbeing, community and skills for independence)
- Removing the barriers of shared resources, offering greater freedom and flexibility
- More suitable and flexible classrooms for learning
- Allocated space for internal and external therapy-based specialists to work with our students effectively

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- Suitable outdoor provision for learning and playing, enriching our curriculum offer and students experiences
- Dining hall and assembly facility, allowing us to offer more social opportunities to our students and their families

Next Step...

- We will be writing to parents to bring 3 of our planned inset days forward to the beginning of September, to bring them together. This will mean students begin the new academic year on **Monday 6th September 2021.**
- Transition for students will begin remotely in the summer term and we are hoping to run a summer holiday transition programme if possible.
- If the relocation is delayed due to Covid 19 the trust has already given consideration too this if there is a slight delay in moving.
