SCHOOL TO GET NEW SENSORY GARDEN

When students return after the summer holidays they'll be able to enjoy a new sensory garden at school. We were very lucky to win the Tesco blue token appeal, with our prize being £1500 of funding to create a small sensory garden. Work has started on the area, clearing all the debris and getting it ready to create a sensory delight for all of our students to enjoy.



STUDENTS GROW BUTTERFLIES

Our KS3 semiformal class had a great time growing their own butterflies. They used a kit that came with caterpillars and they were able to follow them at each stage. They then released the butterflies once they'd grown.





£1 MILLION INVESTMENT INTO NEW SCHOOL FACILITIES

Work is underway at Crosshill to extend school and in doing so create additional classrooms and space for students and staff.

The local authority has invested almost £1 million to create additional capacity at our school. We need to expand as our year seven intake has increased substantially over the last couple of years and in turn, the number of students we have has increased.

The work will refurbish parts of the existing school, as well as create an extension to house four additional classrooms, a life skills room (food tech), sensory room and additional toilets. We are expecting the work to be completed by September in time for new students arriving.



PLANS TO EXPAND AGE RANGE

A public consultation was undertaken last month to consult on expanding our age range to include primary school children. This would provide numerous benefits to primary children who have an EHCP as we'll be able to provide specialist provision, both academically and therapeutically. It will also help to provide seamless provision for vulnerable children when moving into key stage three.

The consultation has now been submitted to the Department of Education and we await their response.

STUDENTS ENJOY THE OUTDOORS

We're very lucky at Crosshill to have the space and surroundings for a forest school. It's an amazing multisensory space used by lots of our students. Research has

shown that forest schools provide multiple benefits for SEND children, including helping to reduce anxiety and stress, as well as building confidence.

We use ours as much as we can and the students love it.
